The Par 72, 7100 yard, 18-hole golf course is the centerpiece of a 600 lot residential subdivision. This Puddicombe designed golf course started construction in 2006 and has been operating as a 9-hole, public golf course with full practice facility for the past 3 years garnering an excellent reputation for its conditioning and design. This prairie-links style golf course makes use of abundant wetlands, natural bush areas and is located 35 minutes from Sherwood Park just off Hwy 16. With four sets of tees ranging from 5000 yards to over 7100 yards it offers all levels of golfer an enjoyable and interesting test of golf. “Opening Day is this Friday, April 23rd” says Spokesman Grant Puddicombe “The golf course will be up and running and construction will commence on the second nine immediately. Since 80% of the work has been completed on the second nine, we should be in a position to open all 18 holes late in 2010 or spring of 2011.”

Laurent LeBlanc of “Homes by Blue Moon” has been active in the construction industry for over 30 years. He has recently been building homes in the Whitetail Crossing subdivision prior to this new venture and partnership with Puddicombe Golf. Laurent will take over as golf operations manager working hand in hand with the Puddicombe team.

Whitetail Crossing GC will join RedTail Landing Golf Club in Edmonton as the second golf course to be owned and operated by the Puddicombe family. Since 1981, Nisku, AB based Puddicombe Golf has been specializing in the design and construction of golf courses locally and internationally.
